Homeowners Forum:




- Two homeowners came forth with tree-related concerns.

Updates and Reminders:



1. Homeowners have reported spotting raccoons in the neighborhood. Please avoid leaving pet food out overnight as it can attract unwanted wildlife that can cause damage to our residences. If you notice raccoons, skunks or possums near your property, you can use a product called Critter Ridder, which is said to be distasteful to the animals, discouraging their attraction to our buildings. Also, please make sure that all trashcans are securely covered if you are going to be leaving them out overnight for garbage pickup.
2. Homeowners are reminded that the street is property of the City of Geneva, and as such, any complaints regarding snow plowing on-street parking or street repair, need to be addressed to the appropriate city department of action. The Homeowners Association is not responsible for these items.
3. Connie Porter has volunteered to handle club house scheduling and rentals. Please contact her with any questions regarding use of the clubhouse. Thank you, Connie, for volunteering and for cleaning the clubhouse!!
4. Homeowners are reminded of the annual requirement to fill out the **Emergency Information Form** (attached) found in your handbook. Please make sure that you include a working email address as this is the primary means that the board will use to contact homeowners regarding Board actions, meeting and activity information as well as other news important to the Kirkwood Community.
5. Any homeowner wishing to report a violation of Kirkwood Rules and Regulations may do so by submitting a **Kirkwood Violation Complaint Form**, a copy of which is available online or in your Homeowners handbook. Please place it in the red mailbox for pickup by a member of the Board.
6. It is a city ordinance to pick up after your dogs. Please a kind dog walker and pick up after your pets.
7. Get your floaties ready! The pool opens Memorial Day Weekend!
8. There is now a safer place for kids to play! Kirkwood will be putting up only one of the tennis court nets this year so that kids can ride their bikes, skate, play, etc. on the tennis court in order to encourage safety in our neighborhood and keep kids from having to resort to the street. One side of the tennis court will still be available for those who wish to play tennis.

Bruschetta with Mozzarella and Smashed Fresh Favas

Ingredients:

- 1 pound fresh fava beans, shelled (about 2 cups)
- 2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
- 1 teaspoon fresh lemon juice
- 1/2 teaspoon finely grated lemon zest
- Salt and freshly ground pepper
- 16 grilled baguette slices
- 1/4 pound buffalo mozzarella, torn into thin strips
- Aged balsamic vinegar, for drizzling
- 2 tablespoons thinly sliced mint leaves

Directions:

In a saucepan of boiling water, cook the fava beans until the skins start to loosen, 1 1/2 minutes. Drain and squeeze out the favas. Transfer the favas to a food processor and add the oil, lemon juice and zest and pulse to a coarse puree. Season with salt and pepper.

Spread the fava-bean puree on the toasts and top with the mozzarella strips. Drizzle the toasts with the balsamic vinegar, scatter the mint on top and serve.
